Once he has been raised to the position of Prime Mover of the evolutive movement of complexity-consciousness, the cosmic-Christ becomes cosmically possible. And at the same time, ipso facto, he acquires and develops in complete plentitude, a veritable omnipresence of transformation. For each one of us, every energy and every thing that happens, is super animated by his influence and his magnetic power.
