1. Put clothing and things you don't want to good use.

If everyone in the U.S. kept their clothing and textiles out of the landfill for one year, it would save the equivalent of nearly 31 million metric tons of carbon emissions. That's the same as taking all the cars in Los Angeles off the road for a year.

The good news is there are many places for donating and recycling clothing and household goods you don't want.

St. Francis Center is in need of specific items to help the homeless and extremely low income individuals and families whom they serve. They are currently looking for:
